Pathways

Paid full or part-time for high school or college students typically 16 and up. Program lengths vary.



Resources Assistants Programs

Paid internships for college students and graduates 17 and up interested in conservation, natural resources, and more. Work 6 to 12 months and earn non-competitive status.



Indian Youth Service Corps

Paid experience working on exciting conservation projects on Indian lands. Work 640 hours to earn non-competitive hiring authority. Preference given to Indian youth.



Public Land Corps

Paid Experience working on conservation and stewardship projects. Work 640 hours to earn a non-competitive hiring authority.



1994 Tribal Scholar Program

Paid tuition and internships for recently accepted or current students of a 1994 Land Grant Institution, who are working to receive a degree in agriculture, food, natural resource sciences, and other related disciplines. Work 640 hours to earn a non-competitive hiring authority.
